**Call to Order:** 7:02 PM

**Pledge of Allegiance:** The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Village President Sielaff.

**Consent Agenda:** Cyr moved, Schweitzer supported to accept the consent agenda with October 13, 2021 minutes and approved bills. All in favor, motion carried.

**Treasure Report:** Forestville received \$4,349.67 for ACT 51

\$2,089.35 went to major roads

\$2,260.32 went to local streets

\$2,491.00 received for revenue sharing

USDA interest payments due December 1, 2021 in the amount of \$19,394.33

The Treasurer gave a reminder to start thinking about the 2022-2023 Budget.

The Sanilac County Sheriff Dept. suggested that the Village of Forestville apply for a radar tracker to help with speeders in the Village of Forestville.

Leaves and Brush can no longer be dropped off at the Village of Forestville Lagoon property.

Hunter Whitehall from McKenna will be here for a public meeting to review and comment on the 2022-2026 Five Year Parks and Recreation Master Plan. Copies of the draft of the Forestville Five-Year Parks and Recreation Plan are available at the Village of Forestville Hall, during normal business hours.

A resolution will have to be adopted to accept the 2022-2026 Five-Year Parks and Recreation Master Plan in order to apply for grants.

**Water/Clerk Report:**

The test call using the Emergency One Call system took place on October 26, 2021 went well. The test call was timed for a half hour. The call resulted in numerous calls to the Village Office with questions about the message received.

The call resulted in several seasonal water turn offs requested.

A report was generated identifying numbers that timed out before being reached and identifying the numbers that had timed out or disconnected. The Clerk will work thru this report to ensure that every account has an up to date phone number in the system.

2- New water services have been paid for in Delaware Twp.

1- New water service was connected in Delaware Twp.

Seasonal water turn offs are steadily being requested.

Water reads went well on Oct. 21, 2021

Approx. 4-5 service addresses are identified needing updated endpoints at each read.

Cellular endpoints are on back order due to the chip shortage.



Discussion of the condition of the General Store presented by Cruz Friday.


Discussion Cruz Friday is requesting a variance for a home based business. Result of discussion prepare a detailed plan and present at the December meeting.
