Tammy received an e-mail from Delaware Twp. Assessor Kenn Wimmer in regards to the

application of Wayne and Karen Cyr to combine two parcels of land in the Village of Forestville.

The application was denied by Delaware Twp. due to two different names on the parcels.

Wayne Cyr informed the council that he is working with his lawyer to resolve this matter.

Water/Clerk Report:

Planning Commission: A notice will be posted looking for an individual to fill the open position on Planning Commission.


